



# Proclamation

WHEREAS: Ireland has historically shared some of its finest sons and daughters with the world; and

WHEREAS: more than three million Irish men and women emigrated to the United States where they distinguished themselves in all facets of life; and

WHEREAS: many of the Irish came to live in Minnesota where they enriched our State with their work, their wit and their wisdom; and

WHEREAS: Irish Minnesotans have provided much of the zest and spirit of the Democratic-Farmer-Labor Party; and

WHEREAS: the Irish American Cultural Institute honors Minnesota by having its headquarters in St. Paul; and

WHEREAS: His Excellency, Dr. Eamonn Kennedy, has served Ireland with distinction during the past 25 years; and

WHEREAS: Dr. Kennedy is currently Ireland's Ambassador Extraordinary to the United Nations;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, November 7, 1975 to be

DR. EAMONN KENNEDY DAY

in Minnesota in honor of his first visit to our state, and confer upon him the title "Minnesotan".
