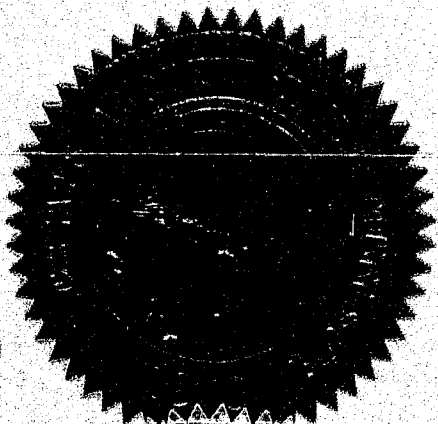


number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Eighth

Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.


Thomas D. Schall was declared to have received the highest
