You will please take notice, that the undersigned, will, within 30 days, file an application in the General Land Office, at Washington, D.C., for the survey of that certain unsurveyed Island located in Farm Island Lake, Aitkin County, Minnesota, more particularly described as follows:

An unsurveyed Island located near the central portion of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Township 46 North, Range 27 West, 4th P.M. Beginning at M.C. on SW Corner of Lot 5 of Sec. 33-46-27, thence N. 69° 58' W. a distance of 1356.5 feet to a point on South End of Lot 3 of Sec. 33-46-27, thence N. 72° 38' W. a distance of 3578.3 feet to the NE point of said Island; and lying 2940 feet due South from the South point of Lot 1 of Sec. 32-46-27, containing approximately 2.32 acres.

You are allowed thirty (30) days from the receipt of this notice, within which to file in said General Land Office, any papers you may wish to submit, tending to show cause, if any there be, why the said Island should not be surveyed and disposed of as public land of the United States.
