WHEREAS: the Saints are fighting for financial survival despite their spectacular success and enthusiastic following:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, January 10, 1976 to be

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to recognize the urgency and join in the effort to retain in our State a great civic resource, the Minnesota Fighting Saints.
