ORDER FOR RETIREMENT

WHEREAS, the Honorable Lawrence J. Green, Judge of the County Court of Anoka County, has heretofore filed with the undersigned Governor of the State of Minnesota his written application for retirement, said application being made under and pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 490.12, and

WHEREAS, the said Judge Lawrence J. Green has submitted evidence that he has served as such judge, or as such judge and as such judge of a court of record for more than forty (40) years,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, acting pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 490.12, do hereby order and direct the retirement of the Honorable Lawrence J. Green, to become effective at the close of business on February 29, 1976. He shall become entitled thereafter to retirement compensation as provided under the law, and I further direct that this Order be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota.


Dear Governor Anderson:
