- REAS: our children and their families have long been in need of adequately centralized comprehensive and specialized health care addressed to their illnesses, the prevention of such illnesses and the maintenance of their health; and
- REAS: there had been a need for protecting our children and their families from the emotional hurts associated with conventional care of physical episodic illness; and
- REAS: Children's Health Center has helped bring about a "therapeutic alliance" between parents and physicians; and
- REAS: Children's Health Center extends its specialty-support to family doctors and dentists in the treatment of simultaneous multiple disabilities; and
- REAS: Children's Health Center is dedicated to its mission to keep our children well and out of the hospital; and
- REAS: Children's Health Center continues to pioneer in our state in innovative models, some of which have resulted in the general acceptance of economical same-day surgery and micro-techniques to reduce pain and radiation; and
- REAS: Children's Health Center conducts a pediatric emergency airlift to every corner of our state; and
- REAS: Children's Health Center has extended this care to children of all ages from new born to adolescents; and
- REAS: Children's opened its doors for these compassionate purposes on February 1, 1973; and
- REAS: February 1, 1976 is the Third Birthday of Children's Health Center;
