



- 3: the first public television station in Minnesota was KTCA-TV inaugurated on September 3, 1957 in the Twin Cities; and
- 3: since that time six more stations have been added, expanding the viewing area of public talevision to more than 95% of the state's population; and
- : these stations have provided invaluable in-school service to more than 90% of the state's school children; and
- the University of Minnesota, the Private College Council, the State College System and other institutions of higher learning in the State of Minnesota have effectively utilized these services for the enhancement of education at the adult level; and
- : through public television there is daily access to extraordinary programming in the arts, public affairs and specialized education;

MEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim 2k of March 7 as
