division 4, and


WHEREAS, the said Judge Beaudoin has indicated in his

WHEREAS, the said Judge Beaudoin has served as such  
judge and as such judge of a court of record for twenty-six (26)  
years,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of  
the State of Minnesota, acting pursuant to the provisions of  
Minnesota Statutes, Section 490.126, Subdivision 2, and 490.124,  
Subdivision 4, do hereby order and direct the retirement of the  
Honorable Irving W. Beaudoin, Judge of the County Court of Dakota  
County, Minnesota to become effective at the close of business  
on March 31, 1976. He shall become entitled thereafter to  
retirement compensation as provided under the law, and I further  
direct that this Order be filed in the Office of the Secretary  
of State of the State of Minnesota.

Dear Governor Anderson:


Pursuant to the provisions of M.S.A. 490.126, Subd. 2, and the further provisions of M.S.A. 490.124, Subd. 4, I herewith make application for Disability Retirement from my public office of County Judge, Dakota County, Minnesota.

Attached hereto for your information and consideration are the medical report from my physician, Dr. Wayne A. Tate, under date of November 28, 1975, and his Physician's Certificate under date of December 10, 1975, indicating that for the reasons set forth therein it is necessary that I retire as a result of my having developed a permanent physical disability.

After twenty-six (26) years of public service as a Municipal and County Court Judge, with my present term of office extending an additional three years, and my having over the years derived great personal and professional satisfaction in the performance of my judicial duties and in the apparent confidence of my colleagues on the Bench, the practicing attorneys and -- above all -- the public generally, I wish to note "for the record" that it is with considerable reluctance and misgivings that I accede to medical advice that I retire when I would will it otherwise.
