



Proclamation

WHEREAS: *the students of the Minnesota State Universities represent, in a very real sense, the future of Minnesota; and*

WHEREAS: *one purpose of education in a democratic society is to produce citizens capable of participating in and contributing to that society, including the governmental process; and*

WHEREAS: *all citizens have the right, if not the obligation, to be informed on issues of public concern and to convey their opinions to the duly elected representatives; and*

WHEREAS: *students at Minnesota State Universities have come to play an increasingly significant role in all phases of the political process in Minnesota;*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Thursday, March 11, 1976 as

STATE UNIVERSITY STUDENT DAY

and do extend to all students visiting the State Capitol a warm and enthusiastic welcome.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-six and of the State the one hundred eighteenth.
