



Proclamation

the Montessori approach to education aims to insure the healthy and normal development of the whole personality of the child, of his physical and emotional faculties as well as his intellectual and spiritual powers; and

the Montessori prepared environment provides the child with the opportunity to discover himself through involvement with colorful practical life, sensory and didactic materials which enable him to learn by doing; and

this freedom of involvement in a prepared setting leads to the development of an "inner discipline" which assists the child in valuing his own worth and thus helps him appreciate the value and worth of other people as well as the world around him;

BEFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the April 1976 to be

MONTESSORI EDUCATION MONTH

Minnesota, and urge the citizens to do all within their considerable power to learn more about the Montessori approach to education and encourage its continued development and growth.
