WHEREAS: H. M. King Carl XVI Gustaf is visiting Minnesota April 8, 9, and 10, 1976 as part of his

27 day visit to the United States in commemoration of the American Swedish Bicentennial

Festival; and

WHEREAS: H. M. Carl XVI Gustaf is the first reigning Swedish monarch to visit the United States;
