the Statewide Emergency Medical Services Advisory Committee, by representative assemble has established the first week in May as "Minnesota Emergency Medical Services Week" WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 3 - 9, 1976 as:

MINNESOTA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens of the State to observe this week by becoming aware of the emergency care given in their local area by the police, fire, resue or ambulance personnel, receiving hospital personnel and by supporting the need for Emergency Medical Services Systems.
