WHEREAS: we are celebrating the nation's bicentennial by applauding the contributions of this country's citizenry and reaffirming our commitment to protecting the rights and freedoms of all people; and

WHEREAS: the Young Women's Christian Association, the largest and oldest women's movement in the world, strives toward assuring equal rights and opportunities for women, youth, and Third World people; and

WHEREAS: the YWCA is a vital force which contributes to the strength and harmony of our democracy through the efforts of more than two million women and girls working toward peace, justice, freedom, and dignity for all people;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 19 - 24, 1976 as

NATIONAL YWCA WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge citizens to join me in recognizing the contributions the YWCAs in Minneapolis, St. Paul, Rochester, Duluth, Mankato, Albert Lea, Hibbing, and Winona have made to our State.
