



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Lyle C. Pearson, a World War II hero, was awarded the Purple Heart, the Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal; and
- WHEREAS: Lyle Pearson is Director of Court Services for Nicollet County and in 1969 received the Corrections Man of the Year Award from the Minnesota Corrections Association; and
- WHEREAS: his service with the Disabled American Veterans began in 1948 when he joined Mankato Chapter No. 10; and
- WHEREAS: in 1950 Lyle Pearson was elected Chapter Commander and has served as Chapter Adjutant for the past fifteen years; and
- WHEREAS: for 25 years Lyle Pearson has worked as a DAV volunteer at St. Peter State Hospital; and
- WHEREAS: in the DAV Department of Minnesota, Lyle Pearson served as Judge Advocate, Junior Vice Commander, and Senior Vice Commander, and was elected Department Commander in 1961; and
- WHEREAS: nationally, Lyle Pearson was elected to the offices of Third, Second and First Junior Vice Commander, becoming National Senior Vice Commander in 1974; and
- WHEREAS: in 1975, Lyle Pearson was entrusted with the DAV's highest office and is now distinguish himself as National Commander; and
- WHEREAS: Lyle Pearson's dedicated leadership and outstanding accomplishments are being recognized on Saturday, April 24, 1976 at a testimonial dinner;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, April 24, 1976 to be
