



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Dorothy Schiager has been a member of Hospital and Nursing Home Employees Union, Local 113, since June 1942, when she joined the staff at Swedish Hospital; and

WHEREAS: she became recording secretary of Local 113 in October, 1942 and has held elective office within the union ever since; and

WHEREAS: she is currently the much admired and highly respected President of Local 113; and

WHEREAS: she served for a period as Secretary-Treasurer of this Union; and

WHEREAS: she is currently Vice President of the Minnesota AFL-CIO; and

WHEREAS: Dorothy Schiager is a trustee of the Minneapolis Central Labor Union and has been exceptionally active in the labor movement; and

WHEREAS: she has served on nearly all Twin City hospital negotiation committees during these years; and

WHEREAS: Dorothy Schiager has also been involved in political activity since the time that Hubert Humphrey was first elected Mayor of Minneapolis; and

WHEREAS: she is now retiring from her long and distinguished career of service to the labor movement;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, May 5, 1976, as

DOROTHY SCHIAGER DAY

in Minnesota, and urge her friends and colleagues to join in wishing her a long, happy and satisfying retirement.
