WHEREAS: the nation will observe National Transportation Week in the period beginning May 17, 1976, in recognition of the role transportation plays in our daily lives and in the defense of our nation; and

WHEREAS: women in railroading have made vital contributions in their daily work, both in peace and war, toward the efficient operation and service of their industry; and

WHEREAS: the members of the National Association of Railway Business Women, during the course of their 55 year history, have been dedicated in their contributions as good neighbors to the social and humanitarian welfare of the people in the 63 cities where there are chapters, as well as to the furtherance of civil and national defense;

I, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby officially proclaim Wednesday, May 19, 1976, in National Transportation Week, as
