



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Fathers render invaluable service to labor, industry, commerce and every field of endeavor which is necessary for the public welfare, and the prosperity of the Nation; and

WHEREAS: we look to the Father in the home as the mold of the children to inspire in them the importance of the moral code and the fundamental laws which govern true brotherhood and to impress upon them the value of all the civic virtues which are the requisites of good American Citizenship; and

WHEREAS: it is appropriate that we designate one day in the year to pay tribute in a broad concurrence of public expression to the dignity in which we hold the Father as the head of the family in our American Society;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, June 20, 1976 as

FATHER'S DAY

in Minnesota, and I call upon the citizens to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this seventeenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-six and of the State the one hundred eighteenth.
