Thomas D. Schall Received Twenty nine thousand seven hundred (29,700) votes
Halvor Stenerson Received Four thousand thirty two (4,032) votes
And the said J. A. O. Pomer having received the
highest number of votes for the Republican nomination for United States Sen-
ator in Congress, of the State of Minnesota, is hereby declared to be the
nominee of said Republican party for United States Senator in Congress.

Magnus Johnson Received Fifty seven thousand five hundred (57,500) votes
Charles A. Lindbergh Received Twenty one thousand eight hundred (21,800) votes
And the said Magnus Johnson having received the
highest number of votes for the Farmer-Labor nomination for United States Sen-
ator in Congress, of the State of Minnesota, is hereby declared to be the
nominee of said Farmer-Labor party for United States Senator in Congress.

DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATES
James A. Carley Received Twenty five hundred (2,500) votes
Francis O. Cary Received Two thousand six hundred (2,600) votes
And the said James A. Carley having received the
highest number of votes for the Democratic nomination for United States Sen-
ator in Congress, of the State of Minnesota, is hereby declared to be the
nominee of said Democratic party for United States Senator in Congress.
