As a prudent individual makes provision for his future, so a state must consider means of continuing its prosperity.

Minnesota has seen the lumber industry rise, thrive and decline. Thr great iron industry will decline when the richer deposits are exhausted. The present agricultural crisis has shown that grain growing cannot be depended upon as the basis of our prosperity. For our future welfare, we must look to industries which do not rob us of our natural wealth and deplete the fertility of our soil.

The last three years have confirmed previous experience and demonstrated that sections where dairying and diversified farming are practiced most intensely, suffer least from the economic disturbances which come periodically. Dairying gives the farmer a steady income month after month and year after year. Instead of destroying, it improves soil fertility, and insures future prosperity.

Minnesota has an ideal soil and climate for dairying. The industry has already brought the state both fame and prosperity. Yet the possibilities for future development are much greater. The average production of butter per cow in Minnesota has been increased fifty per cent in thinty years, yet countires like Switzerland, Denmark and Holland have, shown that by using better methods and better breeds, a production nearly twice as great as Minnesota's can be obtained.

The rapidly growing realization of the value of milk and cream, butter and cheese, in our dietary, especially for growing children, insures an increasing demand and stable prices for dairy products.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J. A. O. Preus, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby designate the week of September 1 to 8, as

STATE DAIRY WEEK.

During that week the Northwest Dairy Exposition will be held at the Minnesota State Fair grounds. I would urge all our citizens, whether they are able to attend that exposition or not, to give special thought and study during that week to the possibilities of profit through the extension of dairying in sections where it is little practiced and through the saving of labor and feed which would result from substituting improved stock for the million or more scrub cows in Minnesota. The welfare of every citizen of the state is directly dependent upon the prosperity of the farmers of the Northwest, and every patriotic citizen should give this problem serious attention.
