



Proclamation

WHEREAS: the union labels, shop cards, store cards and service buttons of the labor organizations of the American trade union movement are symbols of improved working conditions, better wages and increased security brought to the working people of our land through the achievements of the trade union movement and through the process of collective bargaining; and

WHEREAS: the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations and its national Union Label and Service Trades Department, which sponsors and produces UNION LABEL WEEK, have unanimously designated the period of September 6 through 12, 1976 as UNION LABEL WEEK;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 6 through 12, 1976 as

UNION LABEL WEEK

in Minnesota, and call upon all citizens to observe this week as a tribute to the productive efforts of organized labor.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this tenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-six and of the State the one hundred eighteenth.
