ORDINANCE NO. 169

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY AND  
EXTENDING CITY LIMITS.

The City Council of the City of Dawson does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That it is hereby found and determined that the tracts of land situated in the County of Lac Qui Parle, State of Minnesota, described as follows, to-wit:

Tract 1: A tract of land in Section Twenty (20), Township One Hundred Seventeen North (117 N), Range Forty-Three West (43 W), described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of said Section Twenty, thence westerly along the north section line of said Section Twenty a distance of 532.7 feet; thence deflect left 90 degrees and proceed southerly a distance of 63.4 feet; thence deflect left 50 degrees, 30 minutes and proceed southeasterly a distance of 252.7 feet; thence deflect left 21 degrees and proceed southeast by east a distance of 171.7 feet; thence deflect left 11 degrees, 30 minutes and proceed easterly a distance of 166 feet to the east section line of said Section Twenty; thence deflect left 95 degrees and proceed northerly on said east section line a distance of 299 feet to the point of beginning. Said parcel containing 2.69 acres more or less.

Tract 2: That certain tract of land in the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Seventeen (17), Township One Hundred Seventeen North (117 N), Range Forty-Three West (43 W), described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of said Section 17, thence north along the east line of said Section 17, a distance of 660 feet, thence west along a line parallel with the south line of said Section 17 to the point where said line intersects with the southwesterly right of way boundary of the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad as it passes through said SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 17; thence northwesterly along said railroad right of way boundary to the point of intersection with the west line of said SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 17; thence south along said west line to the southwest corner of said SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 17; thence east along the south line of said Section 17 to the point of beginning,

are contiguous with the corporate limits of said City of Dawson and are adaptable to urban government and are suitable for industrial, commercial, and recreational development, and it is in the best interests of the City of Dawson that the above-described territory be annexed to the City of Dawson for all government purposes.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found that the Town Board of the

Town of Riverside, by its resolution dated April 26, 1976, waives all right of objections to and hearing on annexation of said territory otherwise permitted by pertinent statutes and consents to the annexation of said territory to the City of Dawson.

SECTION 3. That all of the said tracts described in Section 1 hereof are annexed to the City of Dawson for all governmental purposes and that the city limits of the City of Dawson are hereby extended and enlarged to include the same, and that all of said territory is hereby zoned as industrial property and is assigned to and made a part of the Third Ward of the City of Dawson.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall be in effect from and after final passage and publication and that true and correct copies thereof be forwarded to and filed with the Minnesota Municipal Commission, the County Auditor of Lac Qui Parle County, Minnesota, and the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota.

Norman Bacon, being duly sworn, on oath, says he is and during all the times here stated has been the publisher and printer of the newspaper known as Dawson Sentinel, and has full knowledge of the facts herein stated as follows: (1) Said newspaper is printed in the English language in newspaper format and in column and sheet form equivalent in printed space to at least 900 square inches. (2) Said newspaper is a weekly and is distributed at least once each week. (3) Said newspaper has 50% of its news columns devoted to news of local interest to the community which it purports to serve and does not wholly duplicate any other publication and is not made up entirely of patents, plate matter and advertisements. (4) Said newspaper is circulated in and near the municipality which it purports to serve, has at least 500 copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers, has an average of at least 75% of its total circulation currently paid or no more than three months in arrears and is sent by first-class matter in its local post-office. (5) Said newspaper purports to serve the City of Dawson in the County of Lac qui Parle and it has its known office of issue in the City of Dawson in said county, established and open during its regular business hours for the gathering of news, sale of advertisements and sale of subscriptions, and maintained by publisher of said newspaper or persons in his employ and subject to his direction and control during all such regular business hours and at which said newspaper is printed. (6) Said newspaper files a copy of each issue immediately with the State Historical Society. (7) Said newspaper has complied with all the foregoing conditions for at least two years preceding the day or date of publication mentioned below. (8) Said newspaper has filed with the Secretary of State of Minnesota prior to January 1, 1968, and each January 1 thereafter an affidavit in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State and signed by the publisher of newspaper, and sworn to before a notary public stating that the newspaper is a legal newspaper.
