- THEAS: Laura Gaskins also has served as president of the Minnesota Adoption Council, president (Twin Cities section) and regional director for the National Council of Negro Women, and vice president of the Minneapolis Urban Coalition; and
- ERFAS: she has long been active in an official capacity on a number of national and community boards concerned with the advancement of human rights; and
- EREAS: Laura Gaskins has conducted staff development training in child welfare in the United States and Canada; and
