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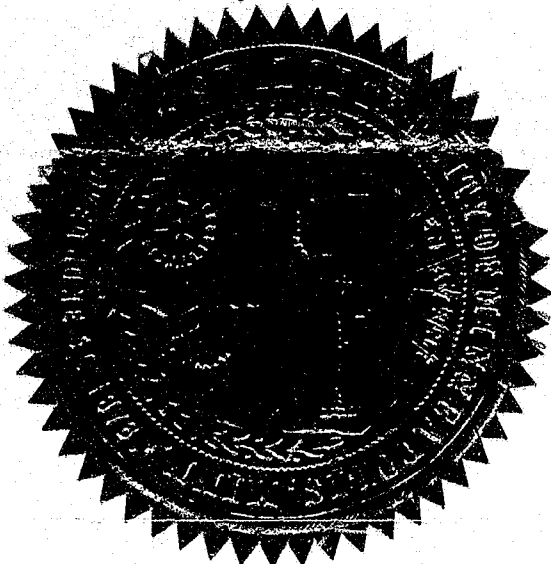

I, Chas. F. Haney, City Clerk of the City of Minneapolis, in the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, do hereby certify that the attached is a true and correct copy of "An Ordinance to accept and become subject to the provisions of An Act passed by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, entitled 'An Act to grant additional powers to the Cities of the State of Minnesota, and to empower such Cities to issue their bonds for certain purposes therein mentioned', approved April 12, 1893"; which said Ordinance was passed at a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Minneapolis, Minn., held June 9th, 1893, by the following vote:--(being more than a three-fourths vote of all the 26 members of the City Council.)

Yeas, 23; Nays, none; as follows:

Was duly approved by His Honor, Wm. H. Eustis, Mayor, June 10th, 1893, and published as required by the Charter of the City, in the Minneapolis Times, the official paper of the City of Minneapolis, June 14th, 1893.

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AN ORDINANCE

To accept and become subject to the provisions of An Act passed by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, entitled 'An Act to grant additional powers to the Cities of the State of Minnesota, and to empower such Cities to issue their bonds for certain purposes therein mentioned', approved April 12, 1893.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1-

That the City of Minneapolis does hereby accept and become subject to An Act and all the provisions of An Act passed by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota at its session in 1893, entitled "An Act to grant additional powers to the Cities of the State of Minnesota, and to empower such Cities to issue their bonds for certain purposes therein mentioned", approved April 12, 1893; and that the City of Minneapolis shall hereafter be subject to the provisions of said Act, and shall be governed, controlled and regulated by and under the provisions of said Act.

SECTION 2-

That upon the passage of this Ordinance by a three-fourths vote of all the members-elect of the City Council and the approval and publication thereof, as provided by the Charter of the City of Minneapolis, the City Clerk shall forward to and file in the office of the Secretary of State, a certified copy of this Ordinance so approved and duly certified, accompanied by a statement of the vote of the City Council thereon with the names of the members voting for and against this Ordinance.

SECTION 3-

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.

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This certifies that the attached and following printed book entitled on the cover thereof "Proposed Charter of the City of Moorhead to be voted upon at a special election to be held Tuesday May 22nd 1900, received this 22nd day of March 1900, Jacob Kiefer, Mayor", prepared pursuant to an order of the District Court of Clay County, Minnesota, dated December 30th 1899 made and signed by L. L. Baxter and D.B. Searle, District Judges, which order is printed upon the first page thereof, and submitted by the Charter Commission named and appointed by said order, consisting of S.G. Constock, C.A. Nye, W.H. Peterson, W.R. Tilletson, Edwin Adams, G.H. Farley, Leslie Telter, P.H. Lamb, L.A. Muntoon, John Costain, M.F. Tenn, F.W. Porritt, W.H. Davy, A.C. Kuhfeld, Chris Holbeck, by their report, dated March 22nd 1900, which report is printed upon page 95 of said printed book, was returned to Jacob Kiefer, the Chief Magistrate of said city, on the 22nd day of March 1900, signed by all the members of said commission and was duly submitted to the qualified voters of the city of Moorhead at a special election duly held in said city ^{in law} according on the 22nd day of May 1900, and was ratified at such election by such qualified voters, by a more than four-sevenths vote thereof, to wit: by a vote of 317 in favor of said charter and 185 opposed thereto, which vote was duly canvassed by the city council of the city of Moorhead on Friday the 25th day of May 1900 and duly declared by said city council to be ratified by said legal voters.

This certifies therefore that that portion of the said attached printed book beginning at the top of page five and following continuously to the bottom of page 94 thereof and entitled "Charter of the City of Moorhead" is the charter of said city and has been duly ratified by the legal voters thereof.
