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## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 410.12, subdivision 7, the following amendment to the Charter of the City of Rochester is recommended to the Common Council of the City of Rochester for enactment by ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 162 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER BY ADDING A SUBSECTION RELATING TO DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS AND BONDS

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. The Charter of the City of Rochester, adopted and ratified on August 22, 1904, as amended and now in force and effect under the provisions of Article XII of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, is further amended, pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 410.12, Subdivision 7, by adding to Section 162 thereof a subsection to read as follows:

162.4 The provisions of section 103.5 do not apply to the establishment of a development district and program and the financing thereof by the segregation of tax increments and the issuance of general obligation bonds pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 472A. or to the financing of projects within such a district by the issuance of revenue bonds under the provisions of other applicable laws, which may be done by resolutions of the common council after such notices and hearings as are required by those laws. Proceeds of such bonds may be expended for the acquisition of property to be disposed of for private development in accordance with the development program.

Section 2. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 410.12, subdivision 7 and shall take effect and be in force 90 days after passage and publication, subject to the provision 5.

## PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT

sworn says that he now is and during all the times hereinafter stated has been GENERAL MANAGER

of the Post-Bulletin Company, publisher and printer of the Rochester Post-Bulletin, a daily newspaper, printed and published in the City of Rochester, in said Olmsted County, State of Minnesota, daily except Sunday of each week;

That he has knowledge of the facts and knows personally that the printed notice hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for TWO TIMES weeks, and that all of said publications were made in the English language, and was printed and published in said newspaper on

- (2) Distributed six days in each week from a known office, established in said place for such publication and employing skilled workmen and the necessary material for preparing and printing the same.
- (3) A newspaper containing general and local news, comment and miscellany, not wholly duplicating any other publication, and not entirely made up of patents, plate matter and advertisements, or any or either of them, and that in its make-up not less than twenty-five per cent of its news columns have been devoted to news of local interest to the community it purports to serve.
- (4) Circulated in and near the municipality which it purports to serve, and has at least 500 copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers, and has an average of at least 75 percent of its total circulation currently paid or no more than three months in arrears, and has entry as second class matter in its local Post Office.
- (5) Has its known office of issue established in Olmsted County, Minnesota, in which lies the municipality which the newspaper purports to serve.
- (6) Has filed a copy of each issue immediately with the State Historical Society.
- (7) Has complied with all the foregoing conditions for at least two years last past.
- (8) Has filed with the Secretary of State, prior to January 1 of each year, an affidavit in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State, and signed by the publisher or managing officer and sworn to before a notary public stating that the newspaper is a legal newspaper.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 162 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER BY ADDING A SUBSECTION RELATING TO DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS AND BONDS
THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER DO ORDAIN:
Section 1. The Charter of the City of Rochester, adopted and ratified on August 22, 1904, as amended and now in force and effect under the provisions of Article XII of the Consistitution of the State of Minnesota, is further amended, pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 410.12, Subdivision 7, by adding to Section 162 thereof a subsection to read as follows:

"162.4 The provisions of section 103.5 do not apply to the establishment of a development district and program and the financing thereof by the segregation of tax increments and the issuance of general obligation bonds pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 472A, or to the financing of projects within such a district by the issuance of revenue bonds under the provisions of other applicable laws, which may be done by resolutions of the common council after such notices and hearings as are required by those laws. Proceeds of such bonds may be expended for the acquisition of property to be disposed of for private development in accordance with the development program."

Section 2. This ordinance, having been recommended by the Charter Commission of the City of Rochester, is enacted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 410.12, Subdivision 7 and shall take effect and be in force 90 days after passage and publication, subject to the provisions of Subdivision 7.
