



Proclamation

WHEREAS: since its founding in 1945 the United Nations has provided a continuing forum for discussion and efforts to resolve international issues that endanger the peace of the world; and

WHEREAS: the United Nations has also been a leader in international humanitarian activities; and

WHEREAS: the United States has continued its active involvement in the United Nations for the past 31 years in order to take advantage of every possible opportunity to achieve international peace, human rights, and human development; and

WHEREAS: it is desirable for Minnesotans to be accurately informed about the broad range of activities of the United Nations; and

WHEREAS: annually since the founding of the United Nations, one day and one week have been set aside as UN Day and UN Week throughout the Nation; and

WHEREAS: the day and week of October 24, 1976, have been so designated;

AND, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim
Friday, October 24, 1976 as

UN DAY

and the week of October 24, 1976 as

UN WEEK

Minnesota, in recognition of the significance of the United Nations, and call upon the citizens of the state to give careful and critical thought to the present and future role of the United Nations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-six and of the State the one hundred eighteenth.
