Proclamation

WHEREAS: there is an ever-increasing need for better understanding of how the lives of all Minnesotans, and often their jobs, are touched by Agriculture each day; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota's farmers are becoming more aware of their role of supplying products which fit consumer needs; and

WHEREAS: communicating these fundamental principles and understanding them are of prime importance to the continued growth of Minnesota and the United States of America; and

WHEREAS: the National Agri-Marketing Association, an organization of agri-business leaders, is planning an American Agriculture Day March 21, 1977; and

WHEREAS: it is planned that this Agriculture Day will have as its theme, "Almost Everything Starts On A Farm", which dramatically points out the interaction and interdependence of rural and urban Americans; and

WHEREAS: the North Central Chapter of NAMA, has endeavored to build a solid bridge of understanding between rural and urban Minnesotans;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 21, 1977 as

MINNESOTA AGRICULTURE DAY

and urge our citizens to make a special effort on this day to consider the importance of Minnesota's agriculture industry and to take advantage of the information which will be made available to them during this effort.
