IN THE MATTER OF THE JOINT RESOLUTION BETWEEN THE CITIES OF VICTORIA, CHASKA, AND WACONIA AND THE TOWNSHIP OF LAKE-TOWN FOR THE ORDERLY ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN LAND TO THE CITY OF VICTORIA

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER

The above-entitled matter came on for hearing before the Minnesota Municipal Board pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 414, as amended, on February 3, 1977 at Chaska, Minnesota. The hearing was conducted by Robert W. Johnson and Gerald J. Isaacs pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 414.01, Subd. 12. Also in attendance were County Commissioners Earl Gnan and Joe Neaton, ex-officio members of the Board. The City of Victoria appeared by and through Robert Nicklaus, the City of Chaska was represented by Luke Melchert, the City of Waconia was represented by Paul Melchert, and Laketown Township was represented by William Kelly. Testimony was heard and records and exhibits were received. The hearing was continued from time to time.

After due and careful consideration of all evidence, together with all records, files and proceedings the Minnesota Municipal Board hereby makes and files the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That a joint resolution for orderly annexation was adopted by the City of Victoria and the Township of Laketown and duly filed with the Minnesota Municipal Board on March 30, 1972. Subsequently, a new joint resolution was adopted by the City of Victoria and the Township of Laketown and duly filed with the Minnesota Municipal Board on December 28, 1976.

2. A resolution was filed by one of the signatories to the joint resolution, Victoria, on December 28, 1976 requesting annexation

-of certain properties within the orderly annexation area. The resolution contained all the information required by statute including a description of the territory subject to annexation which is as follows:

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That part of Sections 11, 12, 13, and 14, Twp. 116 N., R 24 W, Carver County not presently located within the Victoria limits, except that part of said Section 12 lying easterly of Schultz Lake.

3. Due, timely and adequate legal notice of the hearing was published, served and filed.

- 4. Geographic Features
 - a. The area subject to annexation is unincorporated and abuts the City of Victoria.
 - b. The total area of the City of Victoria is 1,892 acres.
 The total area of the territory subject to annexation
 is 2,040 acres (920 acres in Hennepin County Park
 Reserve District), net 1,120 acres.
 - c. The degree of contiguity of the boundaries between the annexing municipality and the proposed annexed property is as follows: Over 50%.
 - d. The natural terrain of the area, including general topography, major watersheds, soil conditions, rivers, lakes and major bluffs is as follows: Some of the property is lakeshore. The rest is relatively flat land.
 Population Data
 - a. The City of Victoria has experienced steady growth and this trend is expected to continue. The 1970 population was 850 and the projected 1980 population is 1,150.
 b. The area subject to annexation has experienced steady growth (estimated population of 192) and this trend is
 - expected to continue. This is true of Laketown Twp. as a whole.

- f. That the City of Victoria is capable of and it is practical for it to provide to the area proposed for annexation the listed municipal services within the next three (3) years.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

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1. The Minnesota Municipal Board duly acquired and now has jurisdiction of the within proceeding.

2. The area subject to annexation is now or is about to become urban or suburban in nature.

3. The City of Victoria is capable of providing the services required by the area described herein within a reasonable time.

4. The mill levy of the annexing municipality on the area proposed for annexation should be increased in substantially equal proportions over a three (3) year period.

5. An order should be issued by the Minnesota Municipal Board annexing the area described herein.

<u>O R D E R</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: That the following described property lying in the Township of Laketown, County of Carver, State of Minnesota, be and the same hereby is annexed to the City of Victoria the same as if it has originally been made a part thereof:

That part of Sections 11, 12, 13, and 14, Twp. 116 N., R24W, Carver County not presently located within the Victoria limits, except that part of said Section 12 lying easterly of Schultz Lake.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the mill levy of the City of Victoria on the property herein ordered annexed shall be increased in substantially equal proportions over a period of three (3) years to equality with the mill levy of the property already within the City. The formula for the step-up shall be as stipulated in the joint agreement filed with the Board December 28, 1976.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the population of the City of Victoria be and the same hereby is increased by 192 for all purposes until the next Federal Census.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the population of the Township of Laketown be and the same hereby is decreased by 192 for all purposes until the next Federal Census.

Also in attendance were County Commissioners Earl Gnan and Joe Neaton, Ex-Officio Members of the Board. The City of Victoria appeared by and through Mr. Robert Nicklaus, Attorney at Law; the City of Chaska was represented by Mr. Luke Melchert, Attorney at Law; the City of Waconia was represented by Mr. Paul Melchert, Attorney at Law; and, the Township of Laketown was represented by Mr. William F. Kelly, Attorney at Law. Testimony was heard, records and exhibits were received. The hearing was continued from time to time.

After due and careful consideration of all evidence, together with all records, files, and proceedings, the Minnesota Municipal Board hereby makes and files the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That a joint resolution for orderly annexation was adopted by the City of Victoris and the Township of Laketown and duly filed with the Minnesota Municipal Board on March 30, 1972.  - b. The total area of the City of Victoria is 1,892 acres. The total area of the territory subject to annexation is 1,340 acres (540 acres are in Hennepin County Park Reserve District) net 800 acres including lakes.
 - c. The degree of contiguity of the boundaries between the annexing municipality and the proposed annexed property is as follows: about 20%.
 - d. The natural terrain of the area, including general topography, major watersheds, soil conditions, rivers, lakes, and major bluffs is as follows: Mostly flat, gentle rolling, some swamp and hills, some lakeshore.
