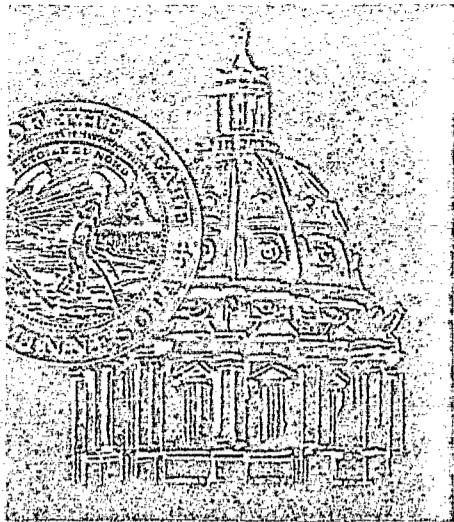

WHEREAS: *students at Minnesota State Universities have come to play an increasingly significant role in all phases of the political process in Minnesota;*


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, March 30, 1977 as
