

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Western Airlines inaugurated service to Minnesota with first flight from Minneapolis/Saint Paul to South Dakota on April 1, 1947; and

WHEREAS: nonstop flights from Minnesota to Denver were inaugurated on April 1, 1949; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota to California service was inaugurated on February 1, 1953; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota to Phoenix service was inaugurated on December 1, 1957; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota to Hawaii service was inaugurated on July 25, 1969; and

WHEREAS: there are now twenty-four flights each day from Minnesota to the Western States served by the Airline;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 1, 1977 as


WESTERN AIRLINES DAY
