never again occurs and

WHEREAS: on Thursday, April 14, 1977, many Minnesotans will be gathering at the Jewish

Community Center of St. Paul to honor the commitment of remembering those who

perished;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby mark this remembrance with the hope that the commemoration of this event will strengthen the resistance of people all over the world to prevent and resist the recurrence of such an event anywhere in the world. I call upon all Minnesotans to join with me in this resolve.
