

WHEREAS: an urgent need for new and replacement tree plantings has been created in

Minnesota because of the continuing spread of elm and oak tree disease; and

WHEREAS: the State of Minnesota is widely known for its urban and rural forest lands, providing shaded cathedral-like archivays along our streets in the summer, and

protecting both homes and soil from the wind in the winter; and

WHEREAS: the people of Minnesota have demonstrated their concern both by private and public

institutions; and

WHEREAS: the best time to plant a tree was twenty years ago, and the second best time is now;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 29, 1977 as

ARBOR DAY

and the morth of May, 1977 an

ARBOR MONTH

in Minnesota, and urge the people of Minnesota to prepare and institute a reforestation program that will be a war against the ravages of shade tree disease, and to declare their dedication to keeping Minnesota green for our future.
