WHEREAS: Dr. Marjorie Hamlin has been a top level administrator in the Roseville Area School District for 27 years, and is now assistant to the Superintendent; and

WHEREAS: she has played a major management role in the District during the period when it grew from less than 2,000 students in 1950 to more than 13,000 in 1970. She was instrumental in the successful passage of 11 building bond referendums which provided the classrooms needed during the period of its rapid growth; and

WHEREAS: Dr. Hamlin was responsible for establishing the hot lunch program that began in 1950 and still retains major responsibility for the 7,000 meals turned out daily; and

WHEREAS: she has worked with officers of the Roseville Area Council PTA, recognized as one of the finest such organizations in the State; and

WHEREAS: in addition to serving on a number of statewide advisory committees, Dr. Hamlin has been associated with the Minnesota Association of School Administrators, and last year represented that organization on a committee that developed recommendations for certification standards for athletic coaches of boys and girls; and

WHEREAS: she has been active in many community organizations, including the Falcon Heights Congregational Church and the Suburban Ramsey Business and Professional Women's Club, and in 1967, was honored by the BPW as the Outstanding Woman of the Year; and

WHEREAS: Lloyd Nielsen, Roseville's Superintendent of Schools, expresses it well: "Marjorie Hamlin has not only made a lasting contribution to this school system through her professional competence, she has also provided an example of the secret to a rich and meaningful life. She has taught us, by her life pattern and style, how men and women can live in dedication and commitment -- not in search of ease, or comfort, or security, but rather in the abundant and constructive use of themselves;" and

WHEREAS: Dr. Hamlin will retire in June and on April 16, she will be guest of konor of a public dinner at Midland Hills Country Club;
