

## OCLAMATION

WHEREAS: hypertension is recognized as a major affliction producing premature sickness,

disability and death and is a leading cause of kidney disease, heart disease,

and stroke; and

WHEREAS: an estimated 300,000 citizens of the State of Minnesota have high blood pressure;

many of these citizens are unaware that they have this disease, and only about

38,000 are now receiving adequate treatment; and

WHEREAS: 15 percent of the adult population over the age of 18 in our communities suffer

from high blood pressure; and

WHEREAS : high blood pressure is the leading cause of death among black citizens in Minnesota

and across the United States; and

WHEREAS: the American Heart Association - Minnesota affiliate, American Red Cross, Kidney

Foundation of the Upper Midwest and Minnesota Department of Health, recognizing the consequences of this disease are cooperating in continuous programs for the

detection and control of hypertension; and

WHEREAS: the knowledge, medications, and other treatment are available to effectively detect

and control this disease so that those who have high blood pressure can take preven-

tive measures;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the

month of May, 1977 as

## HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE MONTH

in Minnesota, and strongly urge all citizens as well as medical, scientific, and health care professions, and voluntary organizations to observe this month by efforts to detect and control this major health problem.
