WHEREAS: this day has been chosen as the all-day greening of the area; and

more than 500 volunteers will wrap, mulch and water Park Board boulevard plantings,

plant new trees and distribute literature on Dutch elm disease detection and control;

WHEREAS: SAVE OUR SHADE is an expanded effort of the program sponsored last year by the

Northeast Kiwanis Club; and

WHEREAS: this year's efforts are sponsored by several Eastside service clubs, businesses and

churches; and

WHEREAS: the program is being coordinated by the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board, the

Governor's Aesthetic Environment Program, and the Shade Tree Task Force of the Com-

mittee for Urban Environment; and

WHEREAS: two thousand Norway pine seedlings from the State Department of Natural Resources will be planted on the east bank of the Mississippi River; and

WHEREAS: more than two hundred 6 x 8 foot trees will be planted in front of Eastside schools,

· libraries, and homes owned by low-income elderly and disabled residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday,

May 14, 1977 to be

SAVE OUR SHADE DAY

in Minnesota.
