THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Upon recommendation of the Charter Commission of the City

of Rochester, and after public hearing duly noticed and held, Section 153 of

the Charter of the City of Rochester is amended to read as follows:

"Section 153. The Secretary of said Board shall also be the Bookkeeper and collector for the City Electric Light Plant. Said Board shall annually appoint a Superintendent of said plant. It shall also appoint and hire such other employees as are necessary for the proper management and operation of such plant, and may discharge them at will. Such Board shall prescribe the duties of such Superintendent, Secretary and employees and shall fix their compensations. Such Board may require from its appointees and employees bonds for the faithful performance of their duties. The amount of such bonds shall be fixed by the Board."

Section2. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes,

Section 410.31, and shall take effect and be in force 90 days after passage

and publication.

The board shall within 60 days after the end of each fiscal year file with the city clerk for the common council a detailed statement of the receipts and disbursements of the board during the preceding fiscal year. It may include in such report any recommendations or information, and the common council may publish the same or such portion thereof as it shall deem advisable.

Section 7. Section 148 of the charter of the city of Rochester is amended to read:

SECTION 148. The term of office of the members of the public utility board appointed by the mayor in 1976 shall expire on the second Monday in June, 1978, and the term of office of the members of the public utility board appointed by the mayor in 1977 shall expire on the second Monday in June, 1979. The term of office of the member of the public utility board appointed by the common council in 1977 shall expire on the second Monday in June, 1979. Should the board member appointed by the common council cease to be a member of the common council he shall be deemed to have vacated his office as a member of the public utility board. Appointments may be made at any time to fill a vacancy for an unexpired term by the mayor to those offices to which it is his duty to appoint and by the common council to the office to which it is the common council's duty to appoint.

Section 8. Chapter X (section 160 and subsections 1 through 14 inclusive) of the charter of the city of Rochester is repealed.

Section 9. Section 1, 5, 6, and 7 of this ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 1978.

Section 10. Section 2, 3, and 4 of this ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 1976.

Section 11. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 410.12, subdivision 7 and shall take effect and be in force 90 days after passage and publication.

Section 5. Section 128 of the charter of the city of Rochester is amended to read:

SECTION 128. There shall be a board of park commissioners of the city of Rochester, to consist of one member from each ward and one member at large, appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the common council. They shall be residents and freeholders of the city. Each shall hold office for two years, except as herein otherwise provided. A park commissioner shall be appointed from each odd numbered ward on the second Monday in June in each odd numbered year and a park commissioner shall be appointed from each even numbered ward on the second Monday in June in each even numbered year. The park commissioner at large shall be appointed on the second Monday in June in each even numbered year. THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Section 8 of the charter of the city of Rochester is amended to read:

SECTION 8. There shall be an annual election for elective officers hereinafter provided, which election shall be known as the "charter election" and shall be held on the third Tuesday in May of each year at such place within each ward as the common council shall designate. The polls shall be kept open from nine o'clock in the forenoon until seven in the afternoon and 10 days previous notice shall be given by the city clerk of said city of the time and place of holding such elections, and the officers to be elected, by posting notices thereof in three of the most public places in the city, and by publishing the same in the official newspaper of said city.

Section 2. Section 14 of the charter of the city of Rochester is amended to read:

SECTION 14. The elective officers of said city shall be a mayor and an alderman-at-large. The mayor shall be elected at the charter election in each odd numbered year and shall hold office for a term of two years and until his successor shall be elected and qualified; provided, however, that the term of office of the mayor to be elected at the charter election in 1977 shall expire on the first Monday in June, 1979. The alderman-at-large shall be elected at the charter election in each even numbered year, and shall hold his office for a term of two years, and until his successor shall be elected and qualified; provided, however, that the term of office of the alderman-at-large to be elected at the charter election in 1976 shall expire on the first Monday in June, 1978.

Section 3. Section 15 of the charter of the city of Rochester is amended to read:

SECTION 15. The elective officers of each ward shall be one alderman. The alderman from each of the odd numbered wards shall be elected in each odd numbered year and shall hold office for two years and until his successor is

"Section 35. Any person to be eligible to appointment in the Police Department shall be a citizen of the United States, shall be able to read and write the English language, and shall not have been convicted of a felony."

Section 2. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 410.31, and shall take effect and be in force 90 days after passage and publication.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE ROCHESTER COMMUN COUNCIL, ADMINISTRATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT, ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES, AND LEVYING OF PROPERTY TAXES; AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER AS FOLLOWS: AMENDING SECTIONS 98 AND 107, REPEALING SECTIONS 114 THROUGH 122, AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 165.

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Section 98 of the Charter of the City of Rochester is

amended to read as follows:

"Section 98. No ordinance shall be passed by the Common Council until it has had two public readings, either in full or by title and description, and at least 25 days shall elapse between readings, except that on unanimous consent of all members present at the time of the second reading, which shall be noted in the record, the second reading may be given on the day of introduction or on any other day."

Section 2. Section 107 of the Charter of the City of Rochester is

amended to read as follows:

"Section 107. The Common Council may create such departments and offices for the administration of the city's affairs as it may deem necessary, and from time to time may alter their duties and organization. The Common Council may abolish or combine departments and offices as it sees fit in the same manner in which they were created. Appointment and removal of the city attorney, city clerk, director of finance, and department heads shall be made final only by majority vote of the Common Council. The Common Council may delegate the appointment and removal of such other officers and employees as it sees fit. All appointments shall be for an indefinite period, and all appointments and removals shall be on such terms and conditions as the Common Council may provide, subject to applicable provisions of this charter and state law."

Section 3. The Charter of the City of Rochester is amended by

adding Section 165 thereto to read as follows:

"Section 165. The Common Council is authorized to levy taxes on all real and personal property within the city to be assessed and collected in the manner provided under the general laws of this state."

Section 4. Sections 114 through and including 122 of the Charter of

the City of Rochester are repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes,

Section 410.31, and shall take effect and be in force 90 days after passage and publication.
