



Proclamation

WHEREAS: *the direction of the State of Minnesota is rooted in its history and the spirit of its people is reflected in its historic past; and*

WHEREAS: *the State of Minnesota is committed to the preservation of its historic places, architectural landmarks and cultural resources so as to enrich the quality of life in Minnesota; and*

WHEREAS: *the exhilarating rate of urbanization, industrialization, and suburban development threatens many areas of historical value; and*

WHEREAS: *this administration gives a high priority to enhancing our peoples' appreciation of their history and historic preservation; and*

WHEREAS: *it is in the public interest to provide a sense of state and community identity through a heightened sense of history -- reflected in our peoples' ethnic, cultural, social, economic, religious, political, architectural and aesthetic heritage;*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 9 through May 13, 1977 to be

NATIONAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION WEEK

in Minnesota.
