

PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT OF PUBLICATION

Donald J. Olson, being duly sworn, on oath says he is and during all the times herein stated has been the publisher and printer of the newspaper known as The Marshall Messenger and has full knowledge of the facts herein stated as follows: (1) Said newspaper is printed in the English language in newspaper format and in column and sheet form equivalent in printed space to at least 900 square inches. (2) Said newspaper is a tri-weekly and is distributed at least twice each week. (3) Said newspaper has 25% of its news columns devoted to news of local interest to the community which it purports to serve and does not wholly duplicate any other publication and is not made up entirely of patents, plate matter and advertisements. (4) Said newspaper is circulated in and near the municipality which it purports to serve, has at least 500 copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers, has an average of at least 75% of its total circulation currently paid or no more than three months in arrears and has entry as second-class matter in its local post-office. (5) Said newspaper purports to serve the city of Marshall in the County of Lyon and it has its known office of issue in the city of Marshall in said county, established and open during its regular business hours for the gathering of news, sale of advertisements and sale of subscriptions and maintained by the managing officer of said newspaper or persons in its employ and subject to his direction and control during all such regular business hours and at which said newspaper is printed. (6) Said newspaper files a copy of each issue immediately with the State Historical Society. (7) Said newspaper has complied with all the foregoing conditions for at least two years preceding the day or dates of publication mentioned below. (8) Said newspaper has filed with the Secretary of State of Minnesota prior to January 1, 1966 and each January 1 thereafter an affidavit in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State and signed by the managing officer of said newspaper and sworn to before a notary public stating that the newspaper is a legal newspaper.

(j) Any motor vehicle parked in any area at any State College contrary to these rules and regulations is deemed a public nuisance, and the president of the respective college may order such vehicle removed and impounded. Cost of such removal and impounding shall be lien against the motor vehicle until paid as provided by law.

SCB 63 Traffic Regulations The State College Board hereby adopts the provisions of the highway traffic regulations as contained in Chapter 169 M.S.A. for the control of traffic on the grounds of the Minnesota State Colleges.


SCB 64 Local Authority The president of each State College is hereby authorized and directed to establish the following:

- (a) speed limitations to prevail on the various streets, driveways, parking lots or sections thereof;
- (b) the locations of stop signs;
- (c) the location of prohibited, restricted, or unrestricted parking areas.

SCB 65 Rules Posted The prevailing traffic and parking requirements shall be clearly marked at each location.

RESOLUTION

November 24, 1969

RESOLVED, that the rules relating to parking and traffic at the campus of Southwest State College be, and they hereby are approved and adopted, pursuant to authority vested in us by M.S. 1967, Section 169.966, Subd. 7, and that Robert Dunlap, President of the State College Board, be and hereby is authorized to sign a copy of the adopted Rules and Regulations pursuant to the requirements of said statute.

SCB 61 Areas Defined The streets, driveways, parking lots and facilities included herein are all those located on state owned property and on property leased by the state at the campuses of Bemidji State College, Mankato State College, Moorhead State College, St. Cloud State College, Southwest State College, and Winona State College.

SCB 62 Parking Regulations On or after November 1, 1962, no motor vehicles whether privately or publicly owned may be parked upon any parking area at a Minnesota State College except in conformity with these rules and regulations. These rules and regulations concerning parking and traffic shall become applicable to the campus of Southwest State College on November 25, 1969.

(a) All parking is prohibited on driveway entrances, on sidewalks, on landscaped areas, at bus stops, safety zones, crosswalks, along yellow painted curbs, within fifteen feet of fire hydrants, within twenty feet of crosswalks or intersections, and in other areas where parking is expressly prohibited.

(b) The president of each of the above mentioned State Colleges may designate any parking lot or parking area as a "restricted" area in the respective college. Such designated areas shall be posted, indicating that the area is restricted.

(c) Parking on a restricted area shall be limited to those persons who have been issued a special permit for parking on a restricted lot or area.

(d) The president of each State College is authorized to issue special parking permits for restricted parking areas on each respective campus upon application and the demonstration of need.

(e) A parking permit for a restricted area will be issued by the college in the form of a card or other identification which must be displayed whenever the car is parked on a restricted lot or area.

(f) Only those cars belonging to a faculty member, staff member, or student of a State College or to other persons having a purpose or function at the college may park on a college parking lot or facility.

(g) The president of each college may require that all faculty, staff or students of a college register their automobiles with the college administration in order to have the benefit of parking in any parking area on a State College campus.

(h) The president of each college may specify certain parking areas as "time restricted" areas and specify the time limitations for parking on such areas. Such areas shall be clearly posted as to the time limitations.

(i) All persons parking automobiles on state owned property will do so at their own risk. No responsibility will be assumed by the college or the state because of loss of property, damage to automobile while parked, damage which may be incurred through the process of impounding the automobile or for any other damage or loss sustained while on a college parking facility.
