

WHEREAS: the United States Coast Guard is celebrating its 187th anniversary on August 4,

1977, said date commemorating also another year of continuous outstanding service

to our citizens on the Inland Waters of the United States; and

WHEREAS: the United States Coast Guard is to be commended for its untiring efforts towards

educating our citizens in water safety, protecting our environment from pollution, assisting our citizens during flood relief activities, and fulfilling its numerous

other humanitarian efforts;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, August 4, 1977 to be

COAST GUARD DAY

in Minnesota, and urge all our citizens to take recognition of the 187th anniversary of the United States Coast Guard.
