

Proclamation

WHEREAS: lungs are the only inner part of the body directly exposed to the outside environment; and

WHEREAS: the lungs are especially vulnerable to germs, smoke and pollution. Disease--even death--can result; and

WHEREAS: six million people in this country suffer with asthma; and

WHEREAS: nearly half of the six million are children under the age of sixteen; and

WHEREAS: asthma is childhood's most common chronic disease; and

WHEREAS: an attack can be set off by a hayride, a pet rabbit, polluted air, or tobacco smoke; and

WHEREAS: children with asthma are especially susceptible to asthma attacks in the fall of the year because of the high pollen content in the atmosphere; and




NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 18, 1977 as


ASTHMA AWARENESS WEEK
