WHEREAS: Our Lady of Lourdes Church, often referred to as the French Church of Minneapolis, was founded in 1877, one hundred years ago; and

WHEREAS: Our Lady of Lourdes Church claims the distinction of being the oldest continuously used church in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Our Lady of Lourdes Church was certified as a historic building "worthy of most careful preservation for the benefit of future generations" by the United States Department of Interior in 1934; and

WHEREAS: the Reverend Alan W. Moss was assigned to Our Lady of Lourdes Church in 1970 and has been the driving force in the restoration effort since 1973; and

WHEREAS: the 100th anniversary celebration of Our Lady of Lourdes Church will take place on Sunday, September 11, 1977;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, September 11, 1977 to be




in Minnesota and, on behalf of the citizens of our state, offer my sincere congratulations to Father Moss and the members of this prestigious church.
