WHEREAS: *public transportation is playing an increasingly important role in society; and*

WHEREAS: *buses, car pools, van pools, and other forms of public transportation have proven valuable in saving precious energy, reducing harmful emissions, and reducing congestion on streets and highways; and*

WHEREAS: *both the costs and the adverse environmental effects of excessive reliance on the private automobile have increased sharply in recent years; and*

WHEREAS: *it is in the best interests of Minnesotans to encourage greater use of all alternatives to the single-passenger automobile;*


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, October 20, 1977 to be


TRANSIT THURSDAY
