



Proclamation

WHEREAS: *it is essential that the public be encouraged to prepare for possible career changes during a working life because vocational patterns are becoming more and more difficult to predict; and*

WHEREAS: *the skills of parents may be less relevant and useful to their children in choosing a career because of rapid technological advances and society unrest; and*

WHEREAS: *there is a need to interpret the many choices available to the public as well as to interpret vocational guidance services to the public. We continue to stress National Career Guidance Week as an annual focal point in these efforts because it brings concentrated attention to the importance and values of career education; and*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of November 6 through November 12, 1977 as

NATIONAL CAREER GUIDANCE WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to observe this week by acquainting themselves with career guidance and its purposes and programs through visits to schools, or by participating in career programs in their areas.
