WHEREAS: the presidents of two related occupational health associations live in Minnesota, a unique distinction for our state; and

WHEREAS: they are: Virginia Carlson, R.N., C.O.H.N. (Registered Nurse, Certified Occupational Health Nurse), St. Paul, president of the American Association of Occupational Health Nurses; and Dr. Bruce Douglas, Rochester, president of the American Occupational Medicine Association; and

WHEREAS: the Minnesota Association of Occupational Health Nurses was organized ten years ago in 1967, with 30 members, and today has a membership of 195 registered professional nurses; and

WHEREAS: the Minnesota Association of Occupational Health Nurses is sponsoring an educational seminar on "Stress and Occupational Health" in cooperation with the Mayo Clinic, on October 13 and 14;




