WHEREAS: this program seeks to involve young people in leadership roles meaningful to them

and their community; and

WHEREAS: the week of February 6 through February 10, 1978, has been designated "Consumer

Education Week" with the central theme "Budgeting Energy;"

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week beginning February 6, 1978 as
