
STATE OF MINNESOTA EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT ST. PAUL

Woodrow Wilson, like all typical Americans, was a lover of heace. He exerted every means within his power to keep America out of the World War, and to bring about a termination of that war. Once our country entered the conflict he marshaled the nation's energies with a view to the speedy ending of the conflict. All the time he was seeking a plan for a permanent world peace.
