WHEREAS: December 7 recalls a day that Americans will never forget and whose significance must be taught to our youth; and


WHEREAS: the Pearl Harbor survivors stand as a living testimony of our continuing obligation to be prepared to defend ourselves;

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY


in Minnesota, and urge attention to the proper commemoration of this event in American history, with due honor to the defenses of Pearl Harbor.
