WHEREAS: Warren C. Hyde was born in Norfolk, Nebraska, grew up in Minneapolis, holds a degree in political science from the University of Wisconsin and did graduate work in public administration at the University of Chicago and the University of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Warren Hyde's career as a municipal manager spans more than three decades; and

WHEREAS: on October 15, 1977, he retired after 22 years of service as Edina's widely respected and able city manager; and

WHEREAS: in February 1955, when Warren Hyde assumed the responsibility for managing all municipal functions in Edina, the population was 15,876; today, about 49,000 citizens live there; and

WHEREAS: Warren Hyde led the way for the building program that qualified Edina as a city with an outstanding park system; and

WHEREAS: Warren Hyde will be remembered as an excellent administrator who not only improved the quality of life in Edina, but in Albert Lea, Janesville, Wisconsin, and Western Springs, Illinois; and

WHEREAS: on January 6, 1978, the citizens of Edina will gather at L'Hotel Sofitel to express their grateful thanks to a man who has played a key role in the growth and development of that city;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, January 6, 1978 to be



in Minnesota, and join his many friends and admirers in commending him on his significant contributions to the well-being of the people of our State.


FURTHERMORE, I wish him continued success in all his future endeavors.
