WHEREAS: the experience of those who have lived before us is important to the success of every endeavor and purpose we undertake; and




NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February, 1978 to be


## AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH
