

Proclamation

WHEREAS: few nations in the world are as important to one another as Canada and the United States, and few enjoy such harmonious relations; and

WHEREAS: the volume of people, goods and ideas moving across our borders is virtually unmatched in the world; and

WHEREAS: Canadian-American Dialogue III, sponsored by the Upper Midwest Council, the World Affairs Center of the University of Minnesota and Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis, in cooperation with the United States Department of State and the Canadian Department of External Affairs, will be held in Minneapolis on April 12 and 13, 1978; and

WHEREAS: Between Friends/Entre Amis, a 220-piece photographic exhibition that was part of Canada's bicentennial gift to the United States, will be shown at the Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis from April 10 to April 28, 1978; and



CANADIAN-AMERICAN WEEK


in Minnesota.
