WHEREAS: May 3, 1978 has been declared by President Carter as Sun Day, a nationwide celebration of the sun as a source of energy; and




NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, May 3, 1978 to be

SUN DAY MINNESOTA


and encourage all Minnesota citizens to take part in activities and events planned throughout the state.
